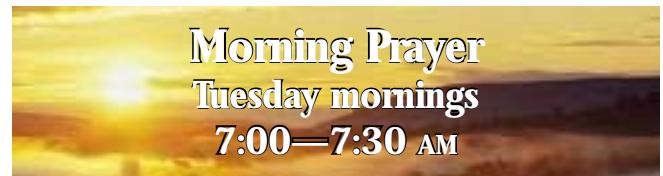

So, I'm determined to do better in the new year. I am going to make a concentrated effort to pay attention to everyone who is involved in conversation with me or in a meeting with me. I can do this; my wife says I can. After all, God's very self calls us to be present with those we encounter; Luther called it "being Jesus for others." It's a holy thing.

Blessings to you in this Holy Season, keep faith with the entire Twelve Days of Christmas and celebrate the Epiphany on January Sixth with all the Wise People who seek God.

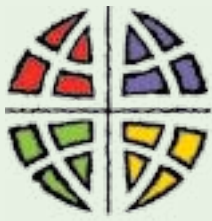

## Become a link in Messiah's Prayer Chain

*<sup>6</sup> Don't be anxious about anything; rather, bring up all of your requests to God in your prayers and petitions, along with giving thanks.*

-Philippians 4:6 (CEB)

Are you aware that Messiah has an email prayer chain? Anyone who wishes to be a link in the chain is invited to do so!

### Here's how it works:

Someone (usually another church member or a friend) calls or emails the church office with a concern for which they are requesting prayers from the members of the Messiah family. Those concerns are listed in the Sunday bulletin, but they are also emailed to a list of pray-ers who start offering up their prayers on behalf of the person in need as soon as they receive the email.

If you would like to be a “link” in our prayer chain, please email Kristin in the church office ([office@messiahknoxville.org](mailto:office@messiahknoxville.org)) and ask her to add you to the prayer chain. Prayer concerns are emailed as soon as possible after receipt of the request. This means that some days you may receive multiple emails and other days you may receive none. You can be added to or removed from the email distribution list at any time upon request.

## CARE

### The OWLs Program at Messiah

The OWLs (Older Wiser Lutherans) Ministry is a ministry to individuals over the age of 55, especially those of retirement age and older. This ministry is made possible by a generous endowment fund established by Kathleen and Merton Badenhop. Messiah has used these funds to hire Mary Sophia Hawks, BSN, RN, FCN, as Parish Nurse and provide her with tools to care for our elders. The fund also allows us to provide her with administrative support. We have used the funds to provide the monthly OWLs luncheon, which also features a speaker, health information and/or entertainment. In addition, we provide support for elders in our congregation who have needs they cannot meet for themselves.

The parish nurse currently serves the congregation in the following capacities:

- Visitation, especially to the homebound, hospitalized, and facility-based members.
- Health education of members, including Messenger articles.
- Transportation of members and neighbors in need.
- Accompanying members to their physician visits.
- Acquisition, maintenance and coordination of the durable medical equipment closet for member use.
- Assistance with Medicare, Social Security, TennCare applications.
- Continuing nursing education.
- Providing referrals for home health, assisted living and nursing home providers.
- Plan and prepare meals with Doris Featherston for OWLs luncheons.
- Post-hospital home visits with members following surgery.
- Advisory member of Badenhop Fund Steering Committee.

The parish nurse currently serves the community in the following capacities:

- Preparing and hosting parish nurse meetings
- Vice chair of the Executive committee for the Council on Aging
- Member of the CAC Leadership Class
- Development of health fairs (see next month's Messenger)

- Problems with building use were discussed and addressed.
- Treasurer's report- we are under budget about \$4,000 for November and short \$4,000 for the year to date.
